



United States Becomes First G7 Country to Participate in GREEN × EXPO 2027

- Strengthening the Bonds Between Japan and the United States
Through the Exhibition of America's Diverse Flora and Public Gardens

The United States has confirmed its participation in GREEN×EXPO 2027 (International Horticultural Expo 2027, Yokohama, Japan), making it the first G7 country to sign a participation contract.

Mr. KOMURA Masato, Secretary General of the Association for the 2027 International Horticultural Expo (GREEN×EXPO Association) and Mr. Thomas E. AUSTIN, Architect of the Capitol (AOC), who will serve as Commissioner of Section for the United States, signed the participation contract on January 14, 2026. Ambassador KOSHIKAWA Kazuhiko, the Commissioner of the Exhibition, countersigned the participation contract.

The EXPO will take place at the site of the U.S. Navy's former Kamiseya Communication Facility, a radio communications station that operated from the 1950s until the late 1990s, after which the facility was closed and the site was returned to the Japanese Government. U.S. participation at this historically significant site will highlight Japan's and the United States' enduring friendship for visitors to the EXPO.

The United States Botanic Garden (USBG), a historic botanic garden under the purview of the AOC, will lead U.S. participation at the EXPO, with the full cooperation of the American Public Gardens Association (APGA).

Mrs. Mary Glass, wife of the U.S. Ambassador to Japan George Glass, will serve as the Commissioner General of the U.S. Exhibit. In this capacity, Mrs. Glass will draw on her strong expertise in U.S. horticulture and landscape design and deep interest in and respect for Japan's time-honored appreciation of nature to showcase the best of U.S. horticulture, innovation, and cooperation.

On January 15, 2026, Dr. Susan K. Pell, USBG Executive Director, together with the U.S. exhibit design team from APGA, visited the EXPO site in Yokohama to begin preparations for the U.S. exhibit.

The U.S. exhibit's theme, "The Pursuit of Happiness," will combine the unique diversity of American plants and public gardens with the aim of connecting EXPO visitors across cultures and generations. The U.S. theme also reflects the EXPO's overarching theme, "Scenery of the Future for Happiness," which conveys to the world a vision of a sustainable and happy future.
